Abstract: This workshop overviews the psychology of suicide and suicidal behaviour, explores working with suicidality therapeutically and overviews and introduces the CAMS model. The work of Thomas Joiner, Israel Orbach, David Jobes and others will be referenced. Participants will have the opportunity to see the CAMS model being used in role play and discuss its integration into various contexts.

Presenter's biography: Eoin is a Senior Clinical and Counselling Psychologist, currently working in the North Dublin Adult Mental Health Service. He is clinical lead for the Suicide Assessment and Treatment Service, and formerly team leader and service co-ordinator for the north Dublin DBT program. Eoin is also a senior CAMS-care consultant providing training to hundreds of mental health professionals in the use of the CAMS model, and has presented at both national and international conferences on the subject. Eoin is a Chartered Psychologist and Associate Fellow with the PSI, an accredited member of the IACP and Clinical Tutor and occasional lecturer with the Doctorate in Clinical Psychology, TCD.
