

A branch of Applied Psychology that is concerned with the collection, examination and presentation of evidence for judicial purposes.

More specifically, it is concerned with the assessment & treatment of offenders, the criminal justice system, rehabilitation.

Evidence & expertise for other professions such as; Police, Probation, Courts, Prison, Judges, Ministers

#### **Inform Decision Making**

#### **Expert Resource for Specialist Assessment**

Criminal courts, solicitors, parole boards, police, health and social care agencies, risk assessment, motivation to address offending behaviour, therapeutic interventions, sentencing recommendations, capacity and fitness to stand trial.

- Direct involvement with client

Any psychological factors relevant to the prisoner which could justify bail?

Can a risk assessment be conducted to determine suitability for community-based supervision?


Is the defendant fit to plead/stand trial?

#### What is the risk of sexual re-offending?

Can you complete a **risk assessment** on our client with a view to assessing suitability for a move to supervised accommodation in the community?

Can you give an account of the defendant's **mental state** leading up the alleged offence and what role did the individual's mental state impact on their offending?

Can you advise on a risk management strategy for this individual?
